Build your own game!

## Setup

1. You will need a bucketful of interlocking toy blocks, such as LEGO®, of varying sizes and colors. Place the blocks on a table between players.
2. You also need a 2-minute timer that can be passed around, preferably with a ringer.
3. Roll 2 dice. The player rolling the highest total is the first host, who runs the timer and decide how to interpret rules during the game.
4. If playing for the first time, set aside any blank cards from the deck.
5. Shuffle the deck. Deal 4 cards to each player. Every card has a different rule or theme.

## How to Play

1. Everyone plays 1 card face-up and places the rest face-down. Discussion is allowed.
2. The host selects 3 of the face-up cards and discards the rest of the face-up cards.
3. The host interprets the cards by explaining the rules for this round.
4. The host starts a new turn by starting the 2-minute timer.
5. Everyone builds at the same time, obeying the rules as explained by the host.
6. At the end of 2 minutes, the turn is over. The host tells everybody that time is up.
7. If the rules for this round need multiple turns, repeat steps 4 to 6 as necessary.
8. Players take turns showing off their creations and giving a short description.
9. The host decides the “winner” with a short explanation. (See “Optional Awards”)
10. Players now pick up their cards, and may discard up to 2 cards and draw until they have a total of 4 cards in their hand.
11. The round is over. The player to the left of the host becomes the new host.

Don't keep score, don't worry about winning. Repeat until everyone is just playing with blocks.

## Optional Awards

- Take a picture of the winner
- Set the winning creation aside to watch the rest of the game
- Tweet a picture of the winner to #bloqprty
- Create a Facebook page for the winner
- Observe a moment of silence to admire the winner before ritual dismantlement
- Take a drink
- Add a new card

## Personalizing Your Deck

If any of the cards don't work for your group, leave them out of the deck. You can also add new themes and rules to the deck using the blank cards. This is your game, so build it your way!
